A donation of \$5,000 was received via Hunter Valley Concrete who are sponsors of the Maitland Showground. The funds will cover the years rent plus pay for the renovations to the kitchen sink area to accommodate the Dishwasher/sanitizer acquired from the Maitland Park Bowling Club and donated by Maitland City Council.  Currently working on a leasing contract, an asset register and a design for the kitchen renovations. A carpenter, gas plumber and electrician to be contacted by the Showground manager Brett Gleeson and Amorelle to provide a get quotes for the stainless steel sink and wet area. Further, the oven to be tested and assessed to make sure that it is in good working order. If the budget exceeds 50% of the \$5,000 then there may be a need for SFHV to make a contribution or to gain a grant to cover the additional cost.
